Behold, the Lamb of God

The Scripture readings this weekend remind us of our call to be a missionary disciple of Jesus. We hear in the first reading the missionary call of the prophet Isaiah (Isa 49:3-6) who reminds us of God's call to each of us from the womb of our mothers to be God's servants, a light to the nations, in order that God's salvation might extend to the ends of the earth. Similarly St. Paul speaks to us in 1Cor 1:1-3 as those who have been sanctified in Christ, called to be holy, called with Christ to further the Kingdom of God, to rebuild broken lives and be emissaries of God's reconciling love. John the Baptist in today's Gospel is pointing out Jesus and identifies Jesus as the Lamb of God. "Lamb of God" is the most meaningful title given to Jesus in the Bible. It is used 29 times in the book of Revelation. It sums up the love, the sacrifice and the triumph of Christ.

Lamb in the Bible is a sign of sacrifice. Based on then Jewish religious culture, according to the Law of Moses, a lamb was sacrificed each morning and evening in the Temple for the sins of the people. Also on the feast of Passover each family sacrificed a lamb and ate its meat in a sacrificial meal. This meal called to mind the meal the People of Israel ate on the night of the first Passover when they were rescued by God from slavery in Egypt.

Secondly, Lamb is a sign of liberation. Lamb also reminds Israel's liberation from slavery. Since sin is a form of slavery and is definitely something that we need rescuing from. So when John the Baptist said 'Look there is the Lamb of God' the people would have had understood that he was making an explicit link with the hundreds of lambs sacrificed for sin in the Temple and also the many more lambs sacrificed on the night of the Passover Feast. John is pointing out that Jesus is the one who is coming to free the people from their sins.

We acknowledge it in the Holy Mass at "the breaking of the bread" proclaiming, "Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world, have mercy on us/grant us peace." Today at Mass, let us look at the Eucharist with love and adoration to affirm our faith in Jesus Christ, truly present in the Eucharist, who was sacrificed for us and opened us to God's forgiveness and joy.
