### Keeping us well

This Sunday, the Scripture readings help us to reflect on gratitude and healing. Naaman, the Syrian military General in the first reading (2 Kgs 5:14-17), was not only an outcast because of his illness but also a non-Israelite. But he returned to thank the Prophet Elisha for the cure, and as a sign of his gratitude, he believed in the God of Israel.

In today's Gospel (Lk 17:11-19), Jesus was on the border between Galilee and Samaria where He was met by a band of ten lepers, including both Jews and Samaritans who were drawn together by their common misery and who ignored their traditional enmity. They prayed to Jesus for healing. The ten lepers were healed on the way to the temple. The Samaritan, the moment he realised that he was healed. returns to Jesus before going to the priests and prostrated himself before Jesus, a sign of deepest respect and honour. The Fathers of the Church identify three parallels between the Gospel story and the story of Naaman. First, both Naaman and the Samaritan leper were foreigners who sought healing from a Jew. Second, both were ordered to perform a small, seemingly irrelevant action. Elisha told Naaman to bathe in the river Jordan seven times. Jesus told the ten lepers to show themselves to the priest who could certify a healing. In both stories, healing took place only after they obeyed. Third, both Naaman and the Samaritan returned to praise God.

Each Sunday, like the Samaritan, we return to celebrate the Eucharist in gratitude for all the gifts that God has showered upon us as individuals and as a community. In faith, we hear the words of the Scriptures as the gift of God's Word to us; we believe that the people around us are the church, the Body of Christ; we affirm the bread and wine truly to be the Risen Lord, the Father's ultimate gift to us. If we count our blessings in life, then we shall be more likely to act like the Samaritan leper to return with joy and give God thanks and praise every Sunday. Any failure to be grateful to God for God's blessing will diminish our friendship with Jesus.

Today let us seek healing from any 'spiritual leprosy' of sins in us including lack of forgiveness or hatred that does discourage us to gather regularly for Mass with gratitude.
