The Baptism of the Lord

The liturgical season of Christmas comes to a conclusion this Sunday with the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord. We often think of why Jesus received baptism from John the Baptist. The baptism from John was a very important event in the life of Jesus. First, it was a moment of decision. It marked the end of Jesus' private life, which prepared him for his public ministry. The public celebration of Baptism was a visible sign of a new chapter in his life. Second, it was a moment of identification with his people in their renewed journey initiated by John the Baptist as the Lord says, "let it be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." Third, this was a moment of heavenly approval. Jesus might have been waiting for a signal of approval from his heavenly Father, and during his baptism Jesus got this approval of himself as the Father's "beloved Son". As the Fathers of the Church point out that the words the voice from the heavenly Father speaks are similar to Psalm 2:17, revealing Jesus' identity ("This is my beloved Son") and of Isaiah 42:1 referring to the "suffering servant": "with whom I am well pleased," revealing Jesus' mission of saving mankind by his suffering and death.

Let us reflect again on the significance of our baptism. On the day of our baptism, as Pope John Paul II explains, 'We were anointed with the oil of catechumens, the sign of Christ's gentle strength to fight against evil. Holy water was poured over us, an effective sign of interior purification through the gift of the Holy Spirit. We were then anointed with Chrism to show that we were thus consecrated in the image of Jesus, the Father's Anointed One. The candle lighted from the paschal candle was a symbol of the light of faith which our parents and godparents must have continually safeguarded and nourished with the life-giving grace of the Spirit.' The white garment given to the child represents birth into a new creation. This week you may consider reflecting on your Baptism or a baptism you have attended, the privilege to be incorporated into the body of Christ, the Church. Similarly, this day let us find a few minutes to chat with our family/friends who share our faith on our baptismal promises in order to live and witness our faith amidst the challenges and struggles of our time.
