You will see that we are celebrating three different Rites of Welcome this weekend. We start with the 35 young adults as they journey towards taking responsibility, as adults, for their faith through the Sacrament of Confirmation. Then we have the families presenting their children for the Sacrament of Baptism. The third group is made up of people who want to be received into full communion with the Catholic Church. All of these are good signs for our parish community.

It is fitting that a mountain would be the place where Jesus would share with his disciples a sermon that can be described in two ways: a character sketch of Jesus and a map to show us how to reach the heights of spiritual life and if we follow the map faithfully, we can expect to find true happiness.

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus is telling us what it means to flourish as a human being made in the image of God. As we ponder the Beatitudes we need to understand that they are not just a list of virtues; they are indicators of a Christ-like life. St Bernard saw them as a sort of roadmap to holiness, a step-by-step guide, leading us from where we are now to where God calls us to be. They show us the type of people we can become if we allow God's grace to shape us—to soften our hearts, smooth our rough edges, and make us into a generous, loving, and compassionate people.

The Beatitudes need to be read dynamically as each Beatitude builds one upon another, and once we begin to take the first few steps, we soon realize that each successive step empowers those that follow. Each step we take is internally transformative. Like any notion of personal or communal growth, we really are not able to see where our journey is taking us until we begin it.

Like any good map the Beatitudes show us the shortest and easiest route. They are but signposts along the way to guide us. There are of course alternative routes which will appear along the way, and we are free to choose them but as we journey on we know what St Thomas Aquinas meant when he said, "God alone satisfies."

Let us keep in our prayers all those who are on a sacramental journey within Jesus especially within our parish community.
